Wellness Basics and Vaccination Schedule

Age of Kitten

Recommended Preventative Care

6-8 Weeks

First examination and first FVRCP vaccination. This helps protect against Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Chlamydia and Panleukopenia Virus. In addition, a routine fecal test (if we can obtain a sample) and routine deworming will be done. A blood test to screen for Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) and Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV) will be performed.

11-12 Weeks

Second examination and second FVRCP vaccination. Depending on the planned lifestyle of your kitten, a vaccination against Feline Leukemia may be recommended. A second routine fecal test and deworming will be performed.

14-16 Weeks

Third examination and final FVRCP vaccination. If you have chosen to vaccinate your cat against Feline Leukemia, it will be boosted during this visit. The Rabies vaccination may be administered during this visit or given as a split vaccination at a separate appointment.

6 Months

Spay or Neuter. If you choose to declaw your kitten, scheduling it to be done at the same time as the Spay or Neuter means your pet undergoes anesthesia only once.

1 Year and Older

FVRCP Booster – EVERY ONE TO THREE YEARS

Rabies Vaccination—ANNUALLY (if required or recommended; some Illinois counties do not require this vaccination).

FeLV Vaccine—ANNUALLY (if recommended due to pet's lifestyle)

FeLV/FIV Blood Screen—ANNUALLY (if recommended due to pet's lifestyle)

Fecal Test—ANNUALLY (to check for internal parasites)
